<p>Design a wanted poster for Guy Fawkes. Remember to say exactly what it is he is wanted for!</p> 	<p>Make a list of birds, mammals and reptiles that live in rainforests. Then make a list of as many foods as you can that come from rainforests. What will happen to all of these if rainforests continue to be cut down? Write a sentence to two to explain it.</p>	<p>On the report template write an information text about an animal of your choice. The opening sentence must tell the reader clearly what sort of an animal it is – a mammal, bird, reptile!</p> 
<p><b>Maths</b></p> <p>Read the different scales on the sheets, Solve the problems.</p> 	<p><b>Science</b></p> <p>At home you have a black box and a recycling bin with a blue lid. Talk to an adult about what you put in them and make a list of each one. What will go in your bin that you do throw away?</p> 	<p><b>English</b></p> <p>Complete the adjective sheet about adding the suffixes -er and -est.</p> 
<p><b>Maths</b></p> <p>Choose 7 foods at home (make sure you ask first!) that are weighed in grammes or kg. Feel the weights of them and try and order them from lightest to heaviest. Once you have done this write down the items and their weights in the order you guessed. It does not matter if any are wrong – practise at this is an important skill!</p>
